



## Young NCB Research Advisers: Role Description

### Young NCB Research Advisers will:

- Help NCB researchers with their projects (for example commenting on research ideas and information for young people taking part in research, looking at draft surveys and interview questions)
- Tell other young people what researchers are finding out (by helping to write summaries of research, articles for the newsletter and updates for the web)
- Help to organise a conference and deliver training for adults on how young people can be involved in research

### Benefits of being a Young NCB Research Adviser include:

- Making sure the work of the NCB Research Centre is relevant to young people
- Getting training in research and presentation skills
- The chance to work with NCB researchers and other young people
- Skills and experience to put on job applications or your CV
- Having a chance to get articles published, speak at a conference, develop web pages and deliver training
- Getting a £20 'Love to Shop' voucher as a thank you for coming to meetings

### To be a Young NCB Research Adviser you should:

- Be 11-16 years old and have an interest in researching issues that affect young people
- Respond to emails or text messages
- Be part of our YNCB online forum
- Come to at least two of the three meetings in London in October 2010, January 2011 and March 2011
- Stick to the agreed group rules of the group and work as a team with other group members
- Have fun!
